Staying Safe

Recently our school community was saddened by the news of the loss of a student at Pitt Town Public School, when a tree fell in the school playground.

In relation to our own school, please be assured that our trees are inspected regularly and that remedial action is taken whenever needed. If you have been part of our school over the past few years, you would have noticed that, over time, a significant number of gum trees have been removed, being replaced by tree varieties less prone to limb breakage. A number of trees were removed from the playground as recently as last December.

Following the Pitt Town accident, all government schools in New South Wales have been instructed to request a report from a qualified arborist before the end of Term 2. We have arranged for an inspection to take place next week – any recommended action will of course be undertaken as soon as possible.

While the majority of our parents are considerate when driving and parking around the school, a handful of drivers are causing concern to local residents. We have been asked to remind parents that parking across driveways in Clements Street is causing difficulties for homeowners. Additionally, the Jim Lynch Pre-school has asked us to remind parents that the pre-school car park is not for the use of parents waiting for students from our school.
